In a Nutshell

A judgemental attitude towards others never promotes love and harmony. We can all feel hurt and offended at times, but if we approach that person with kindness rather than anger, there is more chance of peaceful reconciliation.

Jesus asks us to do all we can to promote love, peace and tolerance, and he assures us that he will be there among us with his support and Encouragement.

W

e find conflicting tensions when we reflect on today's Gospel. It is taken from a chapter of Matthew's Gospel that is all about the way Jesus wanted his Church to function. But today's passage is about exclusion. What do you do if a member does something wrong? You follow a process of charity. Do you go straight to the top authority and report that person? No, you begin more personally by having it out with the one who has offended you. Only after that has failed do you call in others to help: and if that does not work then you appeal to the whole community.

These tensions we can see at home or at church. What happens if parents are always severe and condemning their children And what happens if they indulge and accepts everything their children do, no matter who wrong? Both alternatives are inadequate. Boundaries have to be set in any community so that we know right from wrong. Forgiveness can never be preached with real a authority without first preaching of repentance and judgment.

But we are to be very careful if we find ourselves deciding how the God of Jesus Christ ought to behave. The Gospel shows how often the Lord bursts the boundaries that have been set up by human beings and reaches out in love and mercy to seek out the sinner and the lost and to embrace the outcast. In the Year of Mercy we remembered that more people have been turned away from the Church by its severity and exclusion than by its forgiveness and mercy. And we could learn from the lesson in the way we live together in our homes and churches.

Child Protection Sunday 10th September “See Me, Hear Me”

As has become the custom each year the Child Protection Sunday and preceding week, provides a focus reminding each of us to play a part in protecting our children. This year our theme is “See Me, Hear Me”. The question is how do we here at St Brigid’s parish play our part in listening to children to ensure they are kept safe? This year the National Committee for Professional Standards have commissioned a video and brochure through the Australian Catholic University reflecting on research around what children think about their safety.

In the first reading today, Child Protection Sunday the Prophet Ezekiel speaks of “being a sentry to the House of Israel’. As already stated within our Catholic Communities there is horror, anger and sorrow over the abuse of children. As Pope Francis outlined before leading the crowds in the Angelus prayer in March last year it is important to “Listen: this is the key word. Do not forget, listen to the hurt, sick and marginalized, or among families” As a sentry, each of us plays a part in listening to what the children have to say, making sure that every child is safe and protected from abuse and harm.

Gracious God provide us with a listening heart that we see and hear the voice of each of our children.

We ask you God to strengthen and guide all in our Catholic communities. Grant us the ability and time to listen carefully when children come to us seeking help.

May our institutions and families respect, listen and do what is required to help all children feel safe

Help us to recognise the hurt felt by these wounded initially by abuse then again through the failure to be heard. We stand in constant need of your healing and help.

Let your grace and love fall gently upon our children giving them the inner strength, peace and resilience to seek out assistance when required.

We ask you God to provide each of us with the wisdom to involve children in making institutions and communities safer.

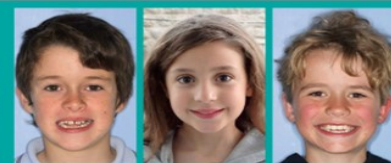

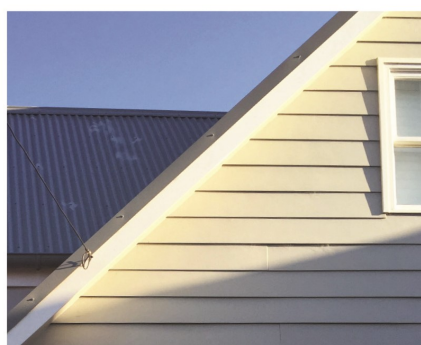
