Today's Readings Isaiah 55:10-11 Romans 8:18-23 Matthew 13:1-23

The rain makes the earth fruitful All creation is waiting for the revelation of the children of God A sower went out to sow.





In a Nutshell Perhaps during our life's journey the word of God has fallen in all the places mentioned in the parable of the sower.

By being attentive to Jesus in our daily lives, we will gradually find that his words will sink deep into our hearts.

We will then become people who have heard the word and allowed the seed to grow and yield fruit. Jesus' day, farmers in Palestine suspended a large bag of seed from their necks and, walking up and down the field, threw the seeds out with both hands as far as they could. Inevitably some seed fell on the edge of the path, some landed on rocks, others among thorns. But other seed landed in rich soil where it produced a great crop. It is one of the few parables that Jesus explains in detail. The seed is the word of God. Some of the scattered seed inevitably bears no fruit when people don't understand it, or if they get overwhelmed by trials



or persecution, or with "the worries of the world" and the "lure of riches". But the great point of the parable is that the word of God produces a bumper crop, maybe thirty or sixty percent, some even on hundred per cent. It is powerful. Palestinian farmers though they had done well if their seeds yielded seven per cent. Ten per cent was a great harvest, thirty percent unheard of .

Where are we in all this? If we are tempted to think that we belong among the seed that fell on the edge of the path or on the rocks or among weeks, think again. Jesus did not relate this parable to discourage us, but rather the reverse, to emphasise that there is no limit to what God's grace can do in us, what God can make of us, and what goodness and fruit God can produce.

The fact is, that we all vary. Some do become wonderful saints; we ask them to pray for us and we can learn from them as role models. There are other people, maybe not saints, who we nonetheless admire for their goodness, love and kindness. But in all the struggles and temptations of our life Jesus tells us never to be discouraged. We may feel we are just hanging on to Jesus by our fingertips: in reality he is other one who is holding on to us, because he loves us. As the Lord declared to Isaiah, "the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do". Mary said the same: "Nothing is impossible to God."


MARRIAGE AND FAMILY SUNDAY 23 JULY
