








2Maccabees 7:1-2.9-14 2Thessalonians 2:16-3:5 Luke 20:27-38 The king of the world will receive us into life eternal at the resurrection May the Lord strengthen you in everything good that you do or say He is not a God of the dead but of the living.



32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C, 9th/10th November, 2019

In a nutshell

He is God of the living; for to him everyone is alive'.

Jesus is our life and resurrection, our pledge of what is to come.

We do not know what life will be like after we die, but Jesus tells us that it is a new life, not just earthly life in another place.

As he is our companion now, so will we be with him for all eternity.

"He is God, not of the dead, but of the living."

Critics may regard this month of prayers for the Holy souls as a Catholic tradition! - they may think that in the face of death, we seem unable to let go of our loved ones. In fact, no matter how deep our grief, this month of prayer is an affirmation of our faith in the power of God's love, which is stronger than death. It is an expression of our hope in the resurrection: that just as God our Father raised Christ from the dead, so he will raise all those who belong to him.

But what difference does faith in the resurrection actually make in our lives? Sometimes religious people are accused of being so heavenly minded that they are of no earthly use—they disengage from this worlds' problems and just focus on churchy matters. That's not where faith in the resurrection should lead us. A Christian charity engaged in practical help for those who are poor once ran a series of advertisements with the slogan: "We believe in life before death". Our belief in the resurrection shows us that to God, life is absolutely important.

God created us for life, not death. "God is God of the living", Jesus tells us, and what we do with our life determines our future life with God.

To believe in the God of Abraham is to believe in the God who wants all to live. And it means that we will strive to defend life and oppose everything that diminishes life or robs people of life in any way—whether such attacks come in the form of physical violence or oppression, illness or lack of education, or economic injustice and inequality. Faith in the resurrection led Jesus to the cross. For Christians, it leads us to cherish life in the here and now and to defend life for all— especially those whose quality of life is most threatened.
