#### In a nutshell

Zacchaeus was determined to see Jesus even if it meant looking silly!

His lifestyle was at odds with Jesus' teaching and the people knew him as a sinner, yet Jesus responded to his heartfelt desire and chose to stay at his house.

This prompted Zacchaeus to admit his sins and promise restitution.

Thus salvation dawned for him! Jesus invites us, too.

#### "Today salvation has come to this house"

St Teresa of Kolkata, more commonly known as Mother Teresa, was once selecting children for a new orphanage of the Missionaries of Charity in East Africa. She could not take every orphaned child and a journalist spoke up, "What are you going to do for the rest?" Mother Teresa looked him straight in the eye and replied, "What are you going to do?" The journalist was so touched by these words that he returned home, gave up his job and started to raise funds for another orphanage in that part of Africa.

Zacchaeus, in today's Gospel, was a senior tax collector. Such people were despised in the own communities. First of all, they were collaborators with the occupying forces of Rome. They made their living by collecting taxes from the local people, in order to support the oppressive structure of imperial Rome. But there was more; they made themselves rich by adding a premium to what they had to deliver to the Romans in order to cover their own expensive lifestyle. If they were going to unpopular in any case, they might as well do it in comfort. Clearly, Zacchaeus was not happy with his way of life. He saw something in Jesus that was different. He wanted to know what it was, and so he climbed a sycamore tree that was along the way Jesus would pass, so that could get a good view and maybe learn his secret.

The point of today's Gospel reading is to show us that the answer to our inner longings is not to acquire more things for ourselves, but rather to build relationships of love and compassion with others who are on the same journey, with Jesus as our leader and guide. He brought salvation to Zacchaeus and his house. He did not condemn what he had been doing, or even ask him to change. Simply by inviting himself into his home, Jesus helped Zacchaeus to make new and better choices for his life. And for those who considered that they were already doing the right thing by ostracising the tax collector, Jesus invited them to broaden their vision of whom God wanted to save: all the family of Abraham, especially those who were lost.

What about us today? Jesus offers us choices. Like Mother Teresa, he asks us, "What are you going to do?" Will you try to find fulfilment in the enjoyment of what the world has to offer in power, pleasure and possessions? Or will you join Jesus on the way of love and compassion in the family of his faithful disciples? The Living Word, 2019


