In a nutshell

Jesus was born in Judea. Today, all the nations seek to welcome and adore him, the light of the world.

The wise men find a baby in very humble circumstances, yet they know that this child is the one for whom they are searching.

The star will guide us too, if we are attentive to the gentle whisper of God's voice urging us to walk in his ways.



The feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus to humankind. The wise men are the representatives of humanity bearing witness to this revelation. However, the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus as not only the Messiah of Israel, but the Saviour of the whole world.

Interestingly, in this gospel that emphasizes the 'Jewish-ness' of Jesus, the witnesses to the birth are gentiles from a foreign land. Their inclusion is a powerful declaration that the revelation of Jesus is for all people. Regardless of the liturgical year, this reading is always used on the feast of the Epiphany to celebrate this pivotal moment.

The wise men, or Magi, are warned in a dream not to go back to Herod and they go home by a different way. How could they do anything but go home another way – indeed, go home as different people? They are changed by their encounter with the child Jesus and they go home a different way; in a different state; in a whole different frame of mind.

When we genuinely encounter Jesus – in scripture, in life, in prayer, in ourselves – then we cannot go home the same way; we must go home by a different way as the Magi did.

Pope Francis' New Year Message, 2020 Pope Francis has entitled it "Peace as a Journey of Hope: Dialogue, Reconciliation and Ecological Conversion"

He writes about ecological conversion, and the following is an extract: (full text available from Church Foyer, and also Parish Office)

"We all need deeper motivation and a new way to dwell in our common home, to accept our differences, to respect and celebrate the life that we have received and share.

"We need to seek living conditions and models of society that favour the continued flourishing of life and development of the common good of the entire human family.

"The ecological conversion for which we are appealing will lead us to a new way of looking at life, as we consider the generosity of the Creator who have given us the earth and called us to share in joy and moderation.

"This conversion must be understood in an integral way, as a transformation of how we relate to our sisters and brothers, to other living beings, to creation in all its rich variety and to the Creator who is the origin and source of all life.

"For Christians, it requires that the effects of their encounter with Jesus Christ become evident in their relationship with the world around them.

"And may all men and women who come into our world experience a life of peace and develop fully the promise of life and love dwelling in their heart."
