

#### In a nutshell

Today's gospel passage reminds us that blindness may not be only a physical disability. Exposure to excessive information can dull our perception of the things that really matter.

The blind man acknowledges that Jesus is from God, yet knowledgeable people are sceptical and disbelieving. Jesus can open the eyes of our minds and hearts if we believe in him and live our lives in the truth.



This is an occasion for all of us - especially in families - to pray more intensely for each other and especially for those who have succumbed to the illness. We should pray also for those at the frontlines - especially doctors, nurses and medical staff and other carers, including clergy - that the Lord will protect them as they place their own wellbeing at risk in the service of all.

# St Brigid's this week and beyond



## Directions For the Archdiocese of Sydney From 18th March 2020 until further notice

Many people are already self isolating and attendance of Masses will be predictably be under 100. But for the sake of caution during this time of pandemic and on the advice from the Bishops conference, the following directions will be observed:

- Individuals should consider their own health, including any potential to infect other with a contagious disease, before attending any public liturgical celebration.
- No indoor Mass or indoor church event should be conducted for over 100 people
- Holy Water must be removed from all fonts
- Alcohol sanitizers are available in the church
- All Ministers of Holy Communion should wash hands before and after distributing.
- The Celebrant should be the only one to drink from the Chalice until further notice.
- It is recommend that the Body of Christ only be administered in the hand because of the high risk of trans mission if people continue to receive on the tongue.
- The faithful who are too unwell to attend Sunday Mass whether due to coronavirus or some other condi tion - or are at particular risk of contracting the COVID-19 virus can honour their Sunday obligation by participating in a time of prayer within the home, reading the scriptures or watching mass on television or online (http://www.stmaryscathedral.org.au/)
- Churches should remain open for private prayer

Holy Week services will be celebrated privately at the Cathedral and can be live streamed or available on demand at (http://www.stmaryscathedral.org.au/)

Further instructions will be issued by the liturgy Office regarding Baptisms of several children, The RCIA and the various days of Holy Week ( if these go ahead)
