The image is of Paul facing shipwreck. The boat acts as a sort of microcosm of the society: Paul and the other prisoners are on the boat; there are the soldiers and the centurion; there are the sailors. There are different layers of society present on that boat.

Paul urges courage and gives everyone a reason to hope. When they eventually manage to get to the safe shores of Malta, the local people welcome them. "They showed us unusual kindness". [Acts 28:2] is where the theme of this year's Week of Prayer comes from.

St Brigid's Parish News

At present we still need to keep the church locked, except when there are Masses. We have resumed 9.30am weekday Masses on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. However, we are restricted to 10 people + priest. Also, we record names and phone numbers, and practice social distancing within the church.

Hopefully, we get word soon to expand with "stage 2", which will allow 20 people for religious services. Given the small number of people allowed, we cannot realistically provide any Sunday Masses—hopefully by late June / early July.

Baptisms are resuming on Sunday morning 7th June (with restricted numbers), and in the weeks following; and we also have bookings for weddings. God bless you all. Fr Phil

Carrot and Walnut Slice

- 1 cup SR flour
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1tspn nutmeg
- 1 1/2 cup brown sugar (lightly packed)
- 125gm butter
- 3/4 cup grated carrot
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- 1sppn carb soda
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 1/2 cup oil
- 1/3 cup milk

- Sift first three ingredients into bow, add sugar, rub in butter.
- Remove 3/4 cup mixture, press over base of greased lamington tin.
- Add carrot, walnuts to remaining mixture, mix well.
- Add oil, milk, carb soda to beaten egg, stir in and mix well.
- Bake in moderate over for 35 minutes.
- Stand for 5 minutes before turning on rack to cool
- Cut into square.


