

### **Family Discussion**

Talk together about how in the time of Jesus, people would sometimes hide their valuables by digging a hole in the ground and burying them. If the person forgot about them, the goods could stay buried for years. Legally they belonged to the person who owned the land, but might be discovered by someone else such as a farm worker. They might sell everything they owned to buy the field and so be the owner of the buried treasure.

In today's gospel, Jesus tells us that the kingdom of heaven is so valuable, worth more than all our possessions, and that we would be very happy if we could sell everything in order to have it. Have a chat about what we can do to find the treasure of God's kingdom for ourselves. What are the treasures of being a follower of Jesus?

## Reflection on this week's Gospel.

Today's readings seem to ask us to consider what is the most important, most precious thing in our lives, and what would we be willing to give up for it.

In the first reading when God tells Solomon, "Ask something of me and I will give it to you", it's as if Solomon has been given a blank check by a person whose checking account has no limit. God himself seems to know full well what Solomon could ask for: riches, long life, the death of enemies. Instead, Solomon requests the one thing that will help him most carry out the tasks God has given him. As the new king of the people of Israel, in order to rule the people fairly and justly, he asks for "an understanding heart / to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong." This is Solomon's "precious pearl, " the one thing his heart desires.

While last Sunday's parables highlighted the growth and spread of the kingdom of God, the two we hear today point to its value above all else. Both the merchant and the man working the field go and sell everything they have to buy the object they have found. As with last week's parables, we might be shocked by what we hear. What merchant would sell all he has to buy only one item?

It seems that Jesus is telling us that when the kingdom of God is found, its value causes all else to diminish in comparison. It is worthy of all our time, our efforts, and our resources. Perhaps these parables call us to discern what is essential and what is superfluous in our lives.

What is your "precious pearl" and what would you be willing to give up to possess it?


