Jeremiah 20:7-9 Romans 12:1-2 Matthew 16:21-27 The word of the Lord God has meant derision for me. May you present your bodies as a living sacrifice. Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself



We all want to belong. Today's readings are about belonging to God. How do we belong to God? To belong to God is to love. Jesus shows us that love is at the very heart of those who belong to God.

Jeremiah is a reluctant prophet who cannot ignore God's call "like a burning fire shut up in my bones." His only answer is "yes" and he belongs to God.

Jesus belongs to God. He is firm in his mission to serve the poor, the rejected and the voiceless, even to the point to losing his life. There were followers of Jesus who sought to stop him, because they were afraid of losing their lives. Fear is the opposite of love. Fear is exclusive; belonging is inclusive.

Jesus was single-minded in his purpose to love and create belonging. He berated those who sought to stop him . Our culture claims that we can protect ourselves by excluding others. Our culture promotes fear and exclusion as the way to preserve life.

In today's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to belong to God; of letting go of fear. What fears do we have to leave behind to belong to God? Are we willing to allow God to entice us and change our behaviour? In today's Eucharist, let us pray that our way of life is an imitation of God who is love.

The Scriptures this weekend

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 16:21-25


Jesus said, "I must go to Jerusalem. There the nation's leaders, the chief priests, and the teachers of the Law of Moses will make me suffer terribly. I will be killed, but three days later I will rise to life."

Then Jesus said to his disciples: "If any of you want to be my followers, you must forget about yourself. You must take up your cross and follow me. If you want to save your life, you will destroy it. But if you give up your life for me, you will find it."

Family Discussion

Talk about times when it is easy to follow Jesus, maybe times when you are with your family and friends doing what you like to do.

Now talk about those times when it is hard to be a follower of Jesus, times when doing the right thing can be difficult e.g., it is lunchtime at school and you are playing a game with your friends. You see someone sitting on their own, watching the game. What do you do? Do you keep playing with your friends and ignore the person on their own? Or do you go over to the person and invite them to join in the game? What if you know your friends will then walk away?
