

In a nutshell

We judge others foolishly, based on what we see. God sees into the heart, and his judgments are just.

We are each given a task to do, and God asks us to do our best.

If we are constantly weighing up rewards for ourselves and others, we miss the point of the Gospel story. Jesus asks us to love him, And then he will be our reward



In today's gospel parable the owner of the vineyard goes out and hires labourers five times throughout the day: dawn, nine o'clock, noon, three o'clock, and five o'clock.

Twice we are told what he can pay. To those hired at dawn he promises "the usual daily wage." At nine o'clock he offer to pay "what is just." In Jesus time, it was normal for workers to receive their pay at the end of each day. In the Jewish law the people are told they must pay their hired servants each day "before the sun goes down, since the servant is poor, and is counting on them."

In the end, what the landowner decides is "just" is to pay all the laborers the daily wage needed to support themselves and their families. There is a fullness and abundance in God's mercy and care that will provide what is enough, what is satisfying, for each. As children of the living God, ware to rejoice in his bounty, what is given both to us and to everyone.
