#### In a nutshell

King David wishes to build a house for the Lord, but God's way is different.

In God's time, Mary is chosen to be the mother of Jesus, the Messiah, who will be given the throne of his ancestor David.

We, too, can be part of God's kingdom, if we say with Mary: 'I am the handmaid of the Lord, let it be as you have said.'

Although Mary was conceived and lived without sin, as a fully human member of the Body of Christ, she experienced human emotions and difficulties. Before she assents to Gabriel's proclamation that she will become the mother to God's own son, Mary is said to be "troubled" and questions how this even can possibly come to be. Gabriel's responds, "Do not be afraid... For nothing will be impossible for God." As disciples of Christ and spiritual children of Mary, we are called to take these words to heart in our own lives.

Being faithful to God's call will very likely lead us to places of discomfort, hardship and even fear. In his book *Ave Maria*, Pope Francis writes, "If a young man of today, a young woman of today, hears a special call from the Lord and is not afraid, that means something is missing. However, when along with enthusiasm for that call there is also the experience of fear, then we can move forward, because God calls us to great things."

In the words of Gabriel we see a pattern for God's action and invitation in human lives. God desires to bring us to a fullness of life beyond our wildest imaginings. To become his collaborators, like Mary, we must both believe in the God of possibilities and be willing to face our fears. Today, as we ponder the message spoken to a young Jewish woman more than two thousand years ago, we might ask, In our own lives of faith do we dare respond to God's invitation by echoing Mary's word of courage and trust, "Be it done to me according to your word"?

## Where does Jesse Tree come from?

The Jesse Tree tradition is rooted in Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of David, Israel's greatest king. And Jesus is descended from the line of David. He is the branch God promised would grow from Jesse's family tree. Each symbol represents a story from within this family tree and a step toward the birth of Jesus.
