### **Today's Readings**

Leviticus 13:1-2.44-46 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1 Mark 1:40-45 As long as he is unclean, he must live alone, outside the camp. Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.

#### In a nutshell

A leper appeals to Jesus' compassion: 'If you want to...' Indeed, Jesus does want to cure him, and not only him, but everyone who asks.

In his joy, the man could not keep the cure to himself, but proclaimed the good news everywhere.

We too can proclaim the Kingdom of God by our joy and enthusiasm in being followers of Christ, because we also have been healed many times. The appeal of **Ash Wednesday** remains powerful. This is true in two senses. The first refers to the enduring popularity of Ash Wednesday. Though it has never been a day of obligation in Australia, people flock to church on this day in impressive numbers. Whatever else brings them, the signing with ashes appeals greatly to our imaginations.

In the second sense the powerful appeal of Ash Wednesday is that we "repent, and believe in the gospel". "Let your hearts be broken not your garments torn, turn to the Lord your God again", cries the prophet Joel. Paul adds his own urgent message, ". . . now is the favourable time; this is the day of salvation".

Jesus invokes the traditional triad of Jewish religious practice – prayer, fasting and almsgiving – and calls for them to be deeply rooted in our hearts. In Australia these profound spiritual attitudes find apt expression in support for Project Compassion.

## Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel—Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In just a few days we will enter the **season of Lent**, a time of preparations, penance, and purification as we look toward our holiest days of the year when we celebrate in a particular way Jesus's passion, death, and resurrection. In today's gospel, a leper approaches Jesus and says, "If you wish, you can make me clean." It is interesting that the leper does not ask Jesus a question: "Can you make me clean?" Or implore him for a favour: "Will you make me clean?" Instead, he comes to Jesus with a statement of faith: "If you wish, you can make me clean."

Perhaps this man has heard of the healings Jesus performed in Capernaum, or maybe he has an intuitive sense of Jesus's closeness to God; in any case, the leper is emboldened to name Jesus as the one who possesses power over sickness.

In Jesus's time people with certain diseases were viewed as "unclean" in the eyes of the community. To protect others from infection, they were isolated from society. When Jesus responds to the man's statement by telling him, "I do will it," he is affirming his desire to bring health and wholeness to both individual and communities broken and separated by disease and fear.

As we prepare for the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, let us take a moment to consider the broken and sinful places in our own lives and in the life of our community . What affliction - whether of mind, body, or spirt - might God be calling us to turn over to him and his infinite mercy? Do we have the faith to say to Jesus, "If you wish, you can make me clean"?
