

Jesus leads the lawyer to explore two questions: Who is my neighbour? To whom am I neighbour?

Jesus asks us the same questions, and draws us to show his compassion towards all people.



Who is my neighbour?

Let the instruction of the Lord God be near you.

All things were created through him and for him.

The story of the Good Samaritan is so familiar that we almost take it for granted. Of course we want to be the Good Samaritan!

It is easy to see the priest and the Levite as villains, walking by on the other side, but they followed the customs of class and the precautions of safety on a dangerous road. When someone has car trouble or asks me for change on the side of the street, I calculate my time and money, weigh the risks, and decide whether I can spare the time, money and risk to help.

The Good Samaritan is willing to care, even at a cost to himself. He takes the risk of being victimized, gives his time and his money, and perhaps most importantly defies social and class customs to do so. Mercy does not offer love that is convenient, expected or easy; it offers loving care when it is unconventional, over the top or even costly.

God has planted this law of mercy inside us: "It is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe." May we be so in touch with God swelling inside each of us that we love generously without counting the cost. May we be more faithful to God's laws than the external rules and customs which become our excuses.


