


### **First Sunday of Advent** Year A 26th/27th November 2022

#### **IN A NUTSHELL**

Isaiah invites us to climb the mountain of the Lord so that we may walk in the ways of peace and justice.

This call to a change of life challenges us to let go of the things that hinder our response to God's love in our lives

Then we will be refreshed in spirit, and so be alert and ready to meet Christ when he comes, even unexpectedly.

### Readings for this weekend

Isaiah 2:1-5 The Lord will gather all nations in eternal peace in the kingdom of God Romans 13:11-14 The time has come, our salvation is near.

Stay awake, you must be ready Matthew 24:37-44

Advent, which begins the Church's liturgical year. Advent encompasses the four Sundays and weekdays leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of preparation for our hearts and minds for the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. The use of the wreath and candles during Advent are a longstanding Catholic tradition that was originally adopted by Christians in the Middle Ages as part of their spiritual preparation for Christmas.

The wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season. The wreath itself, which is made of various evergreens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ.

The candles also have their own special significance. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday. Three of the candles are purple because the color violet is a liturgical color that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice.

The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes hope. It is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah. The second candle, also purple, represents faith. It is called the "Bethlehem Candle" as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

The third candle is pink and symbolizes joy. It is called the "Shephard's Candle," and is pink because rose is a liturgical color for joy. The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday and is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus, as well as the joy that the faithful have reached the midpoint of Advent.

On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Savior. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men.'

The white candle is placed in the middle of the wreath and lit on Christmas Eve. This candle is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ. The color white is for purity—because Christ is our sinless, pure Savior.

Entrance antiphon: To you, my God, I lift my soul, I trust in you; let me never come to shame. Do not let my enemies laugh at me. No one who waits for you is ever put to shame.

Response to the psalm: Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

Gospel acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation.

Alleluia!

#### **Jewellery for victims of Domestic Violence**

WOOLLOOMOOLOO, seems to be a gathering place for people on the margins of society-homeless people, couch dwellers, car dwellers and victims of domestic violence. There are many services offered for these people but one group that we support is the victims of domestic violence. We do this by supporting a lady who lives among the marginalized at Woolloomooloo. Amongst other things, she runs classes for women who have been abused. At the moment they are doing art classes, patchwork quilt classes and jewellery classes.

We try to support these women by providing clean-off cuts of materials and especially costume jewellery. Maybe you lost one earring or your jewellery has got tangled up or it is not trendy anymore; we want that jewellery. The women can sit around, tell their stories, debrief and sort out the jewellery pieces. Then they make them into big pieces e.g. butterflies. They will sell the finished products by setting up stalls at NADOC.

If you can donate any costume jewellery that you are not using please send it to me. Maybe you could also ask your friends to gather up what they are not using and send it along.
