In a nutshell

It is not with great drama that Jesus wants to impress the people, as happened on Mount Horeb in ancient times.

It was when Jesus was in the synagogue,preaching and talking about God that the people came to listen and accept his authority.

The unclean spirit in the tormented man recognises who he is, but Jesus does not want it trumpeted. His words and deeds demonstrate his authority.

Readings for this weekend

Deut 18:15-20I will put my words into the prophet's mouth, and he will tell them all I command.1 Cor 7:32-35The unmarried woman dedicates herself to the things of the Lord, that she might be holyMark 1:21-28This is a new kind of teaching that speaks with authority

Reflection

Our readings today are all about listening. Moses tells the people that God will raise up a prophet from among them, who will speak in God's name and with authority, that it's to him they'll need to listen.

Our responsorial psalm urges us to open our hearts to God's voice. Paul encourages the people of Corinth to free themselves from worry and to listen to God – he promotes the single life as a way to be fully focused on the Lord's affairs. And our Gospel reading describes an encounter in the synagogue in Capernaum, where we find Jesus teaching with authority and driving our unclean spirits. While the onlookers aren't sure what it all means, they recognise Jesus brings authority and a teaching they have never heard before. Today, let's reflect: what do I hear God saying to me today? How well do I listen?

Entrance antiphon: Save, Lord our God, and gather us together from the nations, that we may proclaim your holy name, and glory in your praise.

Response to the psalm: If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Gospel acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! A people in darkness have seen a great light: a radiant dawn shines on those lost in death. Alleluia!
